

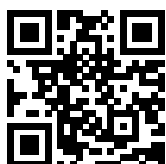

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Do not use FASENRA if you are allergic to benralizumab or any of the ingredients in FASENRA. Do not use to treat sudden breathing problems.

FASENRA may cause serious side effects, including:

- **allergic (hypersensitivity) reactions, including anaphylaxis.** Serious allergic reactions can happen after you get your FASENRA injection. Allergic reactions can sometimes happen hours or days after you get your injection. Tell your healthcare provider or get emergency help right away if you have any of the following symptoms of an allergic reaction:
 - swelling of your face, mouth and tongue
 - breathing problems
 - fainting, dizziness, feeling lightheaded (low blood pressure)
 - rash
 - hives

How do I get my FASENRA prescription?

Here are a few key steps to keep in mind:



1. Your doctor has prescribed FASENRA. Your doctor will submit a claim for FASENRA to your insurance for approval and let you know when it's approved. This may take a few weeks.



2. Once this is completed, you should expect a phone call from your doctor's office or insurance company confirming your approval. They will also provide the contact information for your specialty pharmacy. Your specialty pharmacy is responsible for shipping your medication.

Please write your specialty pharmacy's information on the front of this brochure and enter it into your contacts so you know who is calling. You must answer the call from your specialty pharmacy to confirm your prescription and receive your medication.



3. Your Specialty Pharmacy will deliver FASENRA to your doctor's office or to your home. If the first dose comes to your home, please call your doctor to discuss next steps. And please make sure to refrigerate your FASENRA until you are ready to bring it to your doctor or use it.



Now, you're all set!

Go to your doctor's appointment to receive your first dose or learn how to self-administer if you are using the FASENRA Pen.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont'd)

Before using FASENRA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- are taking oral or inhaled corticosteroid medicines. **Do not** stop taking your corticosteroid medicines unless instructed by your healthcare provider. This may cause other symptoms that were controlled by the corticosteroid medicine to come back
- have a parasitic (helminth) infection
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if FASENRA will harm your unborn baby. Tell your healthcare provider if you become pregnant during your treatment with FASENRA
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if FASENRA passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby if you use FASENRA
- are taking prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, or herbal supplements.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont'd)

Do not stop taking your other medicines unless instructed to do so by your healthcare provider. Tell your healthcare provider if your condition does not get better or if it gets worse after you start treatment with FASENRA.

The most common side effects of FASENRA:

- adults and children 6 years and older with asthma include headache and sore throat
- adults with EGPA include headache
- adults and children 12 years and older with HES include headache, allergic reactions, and flu-like symptoms

These are not all the possible side effects of FASENRA.

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Approved Use

FASENRA is a prescription medicine used:

- with other asthma medicines for the maintenance treatment of asthma in adults and children 6 years and older whose asthma is not controlled with their current asthma medicines. FASENRA is not used to treat sudden breathing problems.
- to treat adults with eosinophilic granulomatosis with polyangiitis (EGPA).
- to treat adults and children 12 years and older with hypereosinophilic syndrome (HES).

FASENRA SAVINGS PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY AND TERMS OF USE

The FASENRA Savings Program is for commercially insured patients to cover patient out-of-pocket costs for FASENRA[®] (benralizumab) subcutaneous injection, and its injection administration and injection education up to \$13,000 per calendar year. Patients with commercial insurance where the health plan does NOT cover FASENRA may qualify for the Denied Patient Savings Program. Subject to eligibility and terms of use.

Patients must have commercial health insurance and a valid prescription for FASENRA. Patients who are enrolled in a state- or federally funded prescription insurance program are not eligible for this offer. This includes patients enrolled in Medicare Part B, Medicare Part D, Medicaid, Medigap, Veterans Affairs (VA), Department of Defense (DoD) programs or TriCare, and patients who are Medicare eligible and enrolled in an employer-sponsored group waiver health plan or government-subsidized prescription drug benefit program for retirees. Patients who are enrolled in a state or federally funded prescription insurance program may not use this program even if they elect to be processed as an uninsured (cash-paying) patient. This offer is not insurance and is restricted to residents of the United States and US Territories. Patients who are residents of Massachusetts or Rhode Island are not eligible for injection administration assistance.
